Liturgical Notes for Advent

+ "Winter" portion of the Breviary begins 1 December

+ The Altar is not ornamented with flowers, the organ is silent, except to sustain the choir (excepting Holy Days, Principal Patrons, Titular Feasts, and Extraordinary Solemnities).

+ The Gloria is not said; the Proper preface of Advent may be used on Sundays and Ferial Days of Advent
